

Patient Safety Best Practices

DESCRIPTION

As post-acute care providers within the state of Oregon, now is the time for us to help guide a culture of patient safety for the residents we serve. Nationally, stakeholders are encouraging increased transparency and voluntary reporting to lead us toward Best Practice development and to move us away from regulating patient safety into our facility programming.
