

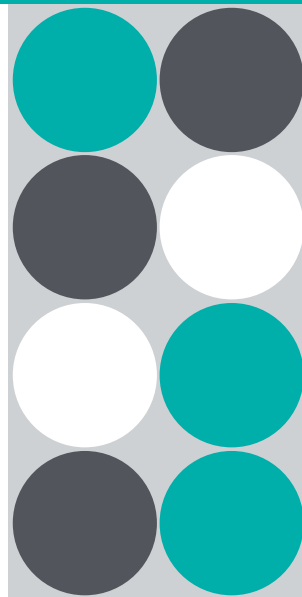

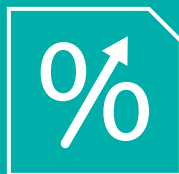

CONSIDER THIS SCENARIO.

NTA reimbursement with Consonus Pharmacist Recommendations:

A patient admitted with 2 NTA points according to the documents submitted (Acute and Chronic Respiratory Failure with Hypoxia and Pulmonary Fibrosis). After an aMRR, a Consonus Pharmacist identified 2 diagnoses missing from the facility record (COPD and Diabetes Mellitus).

If the facility had submitted the MDS with 2 original NTA points, the total reimbursement for the patient would have been \$1,621.83. By reviewing the Consonus Pharmacist recommendation, the facility was able to pull forward the 2 diagnoses from the hospital record, the total NTA reimbursement for the patient was \$2,263.80. This resulted in a \$641.97 revenue gain during this patient's 15-day length of stay.
